BEYOND ABSTRACT RISK

We've talked about the Great Filter. We've talked about coordination failures. These might still feel abstract - interesting ideas, but disconnected from daily life.

Let's make it concrete.

THE SIZE OF THE FUTURE

Do some rough math with me.

WHAT EXTINCTION MEANS

Human extinction isn't just 8 billion deaths. It's the death of **everything that comes after**.

- The universe continues, but empty of meaning.
- Permanent. Irreversible. Forever.



When time stops, it stops forever.

This is what makes existential risk categorically different from other risks. Most bad things can eventually be recovered from. Extinction cannot.

THIS MOMENT IS PIVOTAL

We live in an extraordinarily unusual time:

THE ASYMMETRY

There's a profound asymmetry here:

If we're too cautious and existential risk was never that high: we lose some potential growth, some speed of development. We can recover.

If we're not cautious enough and existential risk was real: we lose everything. Permanently.

The expected value calculation is clear. When the stakes are infinite, caution is warranted.

THE POSITIVE VISION

But this isn't just about avoiding catastrophe. It's about what becomes possible if we succeed.

- Civilization spanning solar systems, then galaxies
- Lifespans measured in centuries, then millennia
- Suffering reduced to near-zero through technology and wisdom
- Art, music, and experiences we can't currently imagine
- Understanding the universe at depths we can't conceive
- Conscious beings flourishing across cosmic scales of time and space

This isn't utopian fantasy. It's what's physically possible if we don't destroy ourselves first.

THIS IS PERSONAL

Your children. Your grandchildren. Their grandchildren. Your community. Your culture. Everything you care about continuing.

We are the ancestors whose choices determine whether any of that exists.
